

The symposium is scheduled for November 6 and 7 at the Artisans Center of Virginia in Waynesboro. Our own Fred Williamson of Crozet will be one of the demonstrators.

Other highlights of the July

meeting were:

\*\*\*\*Discussion of a new chapter wide project for all members to turn something from a similar -sized piece of wood.

\*\*\*\*Plans to have an allday woodturning event in September. Details will be announced.

\*\*\*\*Invitation for all members to donate items to the annual WVPT auction, which occurs in October. The Artisans Center will be a collection point.

\*\*\*\*Plans for Bert Smith, club president, to demonstrate turned picture frames later in the fall.

The idea for the chapter wide project comes from Ray Tilghman, who saw it done by a Florida club. Plans call for each member to receive a standard-sized piece of cherry wood. Members will turn what-

ever they wish from the wood. The turnings will

be judged in various categories in a "blind" judging. Pieces will also be critiqued. Starke Smith volunteered to provide the wood.

In other items of interest, Fred and Mary Williamson received the chapter's thanks for hosting a Saturday woodturning event at their residence, including lunch. It was announced that Young's Hardware in Staunton is willing to stock woodturning-related items. The owner is looking for ideas about what type of merchandise he should stock.

The treasurer reported a balance of \$518.36.

The silent auction had another good response. Members are encouraged to donate wood. Also available are chapter shirts and hats, nametags and turning supplies.

Ray was the featured demonstrator. Twenty-seven members attended.
