The Longaberger company was started by Dave Longaberger, making woven wood baskets, I believe in the 80's (I should have paid more

attention to the tour information. It is now a \$billion per year company, continued by two of Dave's daughters (David died in the late 90's, when he was in his mid-60's). The factory is just under 900,000 square feet, under one roof, and they turn out 35,000 baskets per day. The corporate headquarters is a seven story building shaped in the form of a woven basket (see the picture above).
