About Central Virginia Woodturners

Central Virginia Woodturners is a local chapter of the AAW with over 60 active members. Club meetings are held the third Tuesday of each month from 6:30 to 9:00 P.M. Meetings are held at the Crimora Community Center, with the exception of the last month of each quarter (March, June, September, and December) when they are held at the Miller School in Crozet. Meetings at the Miller School take advantage of the eight well equipped lathes in the school's wood shop where members assist one-another with hands-on turning and simple projects.

Directions: to the Crimora Community Center:

Route 612 just west of Rt. 340 in Crimora.

From Staunton and points north or Lexington and points south, on I-81 take the Verona exit (Rt. 612) east, or from route 11 just north of Verona turn east on Rte. 612 (at the Burger King). Stay on Rt. 612 east for 10-12 miles. As soon as you cross South River, the Crimora community center is on the left.

From Charlottesville and points east, or from Waynesboro, take the Delphine (Lyndhurst) off ramp off I-64 going north (this is Rt. 340) proceed about 7 miles to the Phillips station in Crimora and turn left (Rt. 612). Go about 1 mile and the center is on the right just after the RR tracks.

Directions: to the Miller School:

Take the Crozet exit from I-64 and proceed towards Crozet on Rte. 250. At the Crozet traffic light (the only one on 250 at Crozet) turn south, away from Crozet. There are signs indication the Miller School. Proceed approximately 3 miles to the Miller School entrance on the left. Follow the main road (the sign says Event Parking) to the end at the Main Building. As you come to the Main Building (there is a flag pole in front of it), the shop building is on your left, along with the parking. We meet on the second floor. It will be well lit and should be obvious by the flow of enthusiastic woodturners rushing to the meeting.
