Fred Williamson called the Central Virginia Woodturners (CVW) meeting to order at 6:30 pm. The following items were discussed:

The club library has a new cart. The base was purchased by John Heyden at an auction while Fred Williamson and Miles Eberhart designed and assembled the cabinet and shelves.

Miles Eberhart also built a stand for the club video microphone. Recognition was given to Miles for his contributions.

Fred discussed the need for a replacement camcorder since the majority of club members would like to have CVW demonstrations recorded and available for review. A request to purchase a replacement camcorder estimated to cost \$250 - \$300 was made. Jim Oates made the motion to purchase this

equipment. A unanimous yes vote by the general members was obtained.

Fred encouraged all members to attend and participate in the AAW symposium scheduled for June in Richmond, VA. Fred inquired as to whether CVW members were interested in ride sharing to the AAW symposium. At this time, no members expressed an interest. Ron Dearing mentioned that he currently has a hotel reservation and there are two beds available if any member is interested in sharing. Those interested should contact Ron Dearing directly.

Ron Dearing mentioned that the AAW symposium has requested a donation of a recommended \$200 for expenses affiliated with the gallery show. There will be a month long gallery exhibit. This exhibit is different from the Symposium's Instant Gallery. The requested money would be used to ship gallery items, which were not sold at the conclusion of the gallery show, back to the artist. Ron reported that the AAW has requested that the VA woodturning clubs foot this bill. Details regarding the name of the gallery, and specifics for entering pieces were not available at this time. Tom Evans made a motion for the club to support the AAW efforts by making a donation. The majority vote by general members was obtained. Ron Dearing will provide additional details as they become available.

Ron Dearing donated a Wood Tech Lathe demo (DVD) to the library. Ron reported that he has a catalog and anyone interested should contact him directly.

Recognition was given to Betty Gruber and her contributions to the club newsletter.

Treasurer's Report:

Current balance is \$1746 after deposits and payment of \$100 to the Crimora Ruritans for the next 4 months rent.

Show and Tell:

This session was initiated by Fred Williamson and continued with the assistance of Bert Smith. There was a large selection of turned pieces and helpful hints. Hilel Solamon and another member were recipients of a Craft Supply Gift Certificate.

Silent Auction:

Dennis Hippen managed the auction. The auction had much action and rendered \$128.50, which almost topped the January record of \$130.25.

Directions—to the Crimora Community Center on Route 612 just west of Rt. 340 in Crimora.

From Staunton and points north-

From I-81 take the Rt. 612 exit (Verona Exit) east, or

From route 11 just north of Verona, turn east onto Rt. 612, across from Burger King.

Stay on 612, for 10-12 miles.

As soon as you cross South River, the Crimora Community Center is on your left.

From Charlottesville and points east, from I-64—

Take Exit 96 (Lyndhurst Exit) and go north on Delphine Street.

After a mile of so you will cross 250E at the Hess Station and join 340 north.

Alternatively you can take Exit 99 at the top of Afton Mountain and get onto $250~\mathrm{West}$.

Go 3 miles to turn right at the Hess Station, 340 north.

From there it is 6 miles to Crimora.

Turn Left on Rt. 612 at the BP gas station.

Go about 1 mile crossing RR tracks. The center is on the right just after the RR tracks.
