Over 20 of his elegant forms were on display today, illustrating an almost musical quality in their smooth flow of line and shape.

I have one correction on my sanding demo. My finest grit on the Makita sander is 500, not 400. I realized my error when I got home. I used 400 for years and simply reverted to form when I labeled the bottom of the bowls. (I forgot to mention that, hope people picked up on it as the bowls were passed around.) The new 500 grit gold is a little bit finer and still does not glaze over right away like the 600 grit does.

I wonder if we could get away with our own lighting right in the demo area, do away with the big room lights.

### The General Meeting:

Fred Williamson called the Central Virginia Woodturners (CVW) meeting to order at 6:30 pm. the following items were discussed:

Fred thanked Jim Higgins for his wellattended demonstration on segmented turning.

The club used the newly purchased projector and screen during the meeting. The club plans to purchase foam window coverings to diminish glare on the screen. The club's storage room was inventoried and cleared out. Two televisions, no longer being used, were free for the taking to anyone interested.

Tom Evans announced that the Shenandoah Valley Artisan Center (SVAC), in Waynesboro, has offered an invitation for the CVW club to display work in the gallery during the month of September. Tom indicated that approximately 35-40 pieces of woodturnings from members would be displayed. The SVAC charges the artist 20% of all sales. This event is expected to be good exposure for the CVW club as well as individual members. Anyone interested in participating in this event, must have his or her woodturnings delivered to Tom by mid-August. This is a great opportunity for members to display their woodturnings as well as advertisement for CVW.

Bert Smith will be the featured artist in March at the Artisan's Center of Virginia in Waynesboro. Bert indicated that all CVW members should be receiving an invitation.

Dennis Hippen informed the club that he received the annual renewal notice for CVW commercial property insurance premium. Dennis indicated that the annual premium increased from \$192 to \$203. The policy coverage is for \$20,000 with a \$500 deductible. All of the club's assets were documented and on file. Dave Potter made a motion to pay the premium and a unanimous vote was obtained.

The club purchased two bookcases for the library. The cases were tailored to the library's needs by securing the cases to each other and putting them on wheels.

Willie Simmons will be doing a special demo for us Saturday, March 14, starting at 10 AM. Below is are some photos of his work and the description the things he will be covering.

Willie describes his demonstration as follows:

I will start by showing different cuts to be made with the skew and spindle gouges. I'll explain how I make the cuts and why. There will be exercises to help you become better with spindle tools. I'll also turn a few projects between centers. You will see two pepper mills, bottle stopper, and a stool. There will even be a short time spent on weaving a fiber rush and splint seat. There may even be a joke or two shared.



The photos on this page are just a sampling of what Willie Simmons is sharing with us. We can look forward to learning a variety of techniques.



**Central Virginia Woodturners** is a local chapter of the AAW with over 69 active members. Club meetings are held the third Tuesday of each month from 6:30 to 9:00 P.M. Meetings are held at the Crimora Community Center.

**Directions**—to the Crimora Community Center on Route 612 just west of Rt. 340 in Crimora.

### From Staunton and points north-

From I-81 take the Rt. 612 exit (Verona Exit) east, or From route 11 just north of Verona, turn east onto Rt. 612, across from Burger King.

Stay on 612, for 10-12 miles.

As soon as you cross South River, the Crimora Community Center is on your left.

### From Charlottesville and points east, from I-64—

Take Exit 96 (Lyndhurst Exit) and go north on Delphine Street. After a mile of so you will cross 250E at the Hess Station and join 340 north. Alternatively you can take Exit 99 at the top of Afton Mountain and get onto 250 West. Go 3 miles to turn right at the Hess Station, 340 north.

From there it is 6 miles to Crimora.

Turn Left on Rt. 612 at the BP gas station.

Go about 1 mile crossing RR tracks. The center is on the right just after the RR tracks.
