August 20th 2019 Meeting Minutes

And aah one and aah two..



The August meeting, attended by approximately 61, was called to order by President Bill Hemminger at 6:30 followed by an opening prayer. In his opening remarks, Bill noted the upcoming member tool sale at the September skills session in conjunction with the availability of a wide variety of shop equipment from Nancy Hildebrand. The September President's challenge is to turn a torus (donut shaped) form. The updated CVW brochure will be ready at the next regular meeting.

August Meeting cont.

Bill complimented John Hinton, and Norm Dallura, on their updates and redesigns of the newsletter and website respectively. Norm invited members to submit photos of their work for the gallery.

Joel Spring, Membership VP introduced three visitors; Heather Evens, Robert Ham, and William Miller and new member Gail Delaney.

Jerry Jorgensen gave the treasurers report. He also reminded the group of the potential group buy from Woodturning Wonders. At this time 1/3 of the minimum purchase has been met.

Jim Oates reported that 20 turners attended the August skills session. During his safety minute, Jim described getting a poison oak rash from the bark of a maple piece. Be aware of the origin of wood. He also reminded members to submit bios for the website.

Programs VP Mike Sorge introduced Dave Swiger to discuss carbide vs HSS tools. Dave described the various Easy Wood carbide tipped tools and their respective applications. During his discussion, he made the following points:

The roughing gouge will leave a smoother finish

Gouges are much faster than carbide, although this may only be important to the production turner.

Flexibility of HSS tools as the configuration, angle, and wings, may be ground to the turner's preference.

Easy Wood has a goosenecked tool for hollowing through a narrow opening. He feels that the carbide tools have an advantage for hollowing.

Following the break, Dave Swiger demonstrated turning the Burnt Ash Lidded Box. He mentioned that Jimmy Clewes and Nick Cook turn this box. His method is a combination of the two methods.

Dave starts with a 2"x9" blank for the base. He described the process of mounting the blank on a wood worm screw, noting that the cup side of the blank should be against the screw. Burning the surface is done with MAP gas, his preference as opposed to propane. The burnt surface is brushed lightly with a soft brass brush with the grain to bring out the wood texture.

The meeting was concluded at approximately 9:30




Gauge to Cut on Centerline

When you need to set your tool on the centerline such as when hollowing a vessel, it can be hard to 'see' the center in the bottom. I made a gauge out of some 1/4" scrap about 2" wide. I installed my spur drive in the headstock, set the scrap upright against the spur center and tapped it to mark the centerline. I then carefully cut it to split that mark. As you see in the photo, the cutting edge is set to the top of the gauge.
