
President's Corner

Elbert Dale - Walnut box with finger top lid finial and several tops inside.

Mars Champaign - Laminate pepper mills with walnut oil finish, several key chains with Doctor's Wood finish, some of which were patterned with a chatter tool.

Dennis Hippen - Several bowls: Mango, spalted white birch (the chamber pot), spalted cherry, 2 red elm, 5 from a red maple burl (3 cored) and one from the same tree. A pen of hardened oak root burl, magnifying glass of Monticello poplar.

Mike Sorge - 2 bubinga platters, a curly maple bowl, and his signature box of ambrosia maple and walnut.

Peter Welch - A piece of cherry from the beaches at Normandy in France and 2 bullet pens from that cherry







Spiral Lathe Demo




Ernest Floyd from Mt. Solon gave a demo on his spiral candlesticks. He does some of

that it was not a complicated as it looked. A very informative demonstration. Thanks Ernest. There was a lot of noise and chips.








