You are invited to write something to share with fellow woodturners, be it amusing, informative, instructive, or scary. It can be personal, anonymous, or professional.


I am always looking for better ways to do turning stuff. About 2 years ago someone suggested the water base sanding sealer made by Minwax. I found it at Lowes.

I use it on all bowls and rolling pins and if wood has a tendency to go dog brown, I apply at least 2 or more coats on the lathe. Sand between coats at 600 grit.

I like that I can use oil or water based next finishing coats over it. It dries faster than advertised. Does not skim and I think provides more clear depth when done. Product does not claim to have RV protection as some water-based finishes.

The cedar charcuterie board had 3 sanding sealer coats before oil base 2 coats. Likely did the same to the cedar coins (all sold). Alex, have any coins? Pen finishing is different.


