





At a recent Saturday morning members only get together we talked about bowls and I urged new turners to think about starting small. Here is an example of doing that. I had a piece of 5/4 kiln dried cherry left over from a project. I was able to cut seven 4 & 5" bowl blanks. Here is one on the lathe and all seven after turning. They are finished with TY oil. The final shot is some of the bowls laser engraved with an interlocking heart graphic designed by my wife. They are now "Sweet Heart Bowls".

The lathe shot shows the true wood color.
